

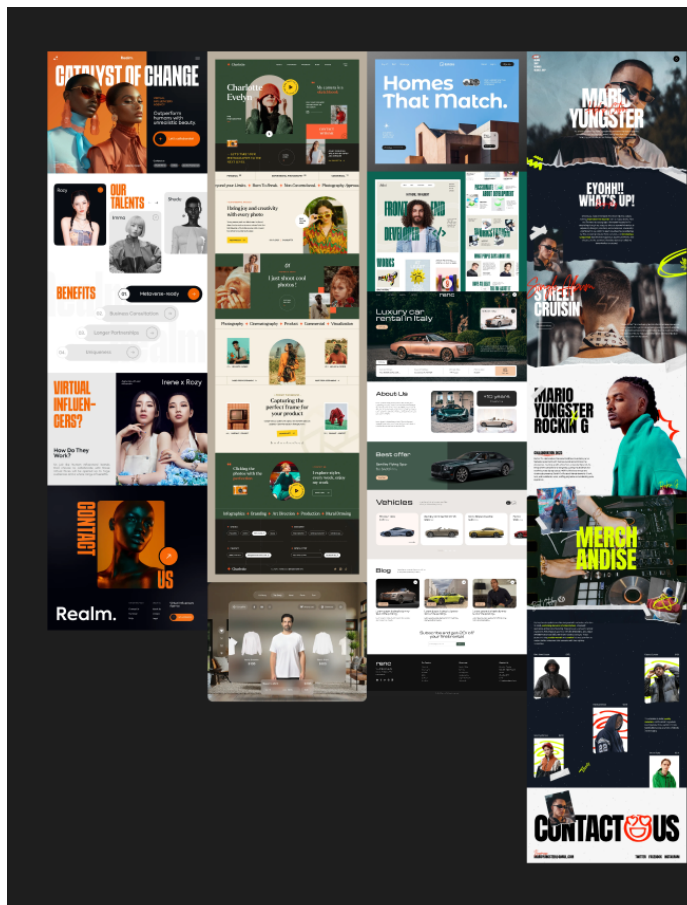
Portfolio Documentation Overview

This document explains the structure and content of my personal portfolio. I made it using HTML, CSS, and JavaScript. The portfolio shows my work, learning progress, and the skills I developed during my Media Design studies.

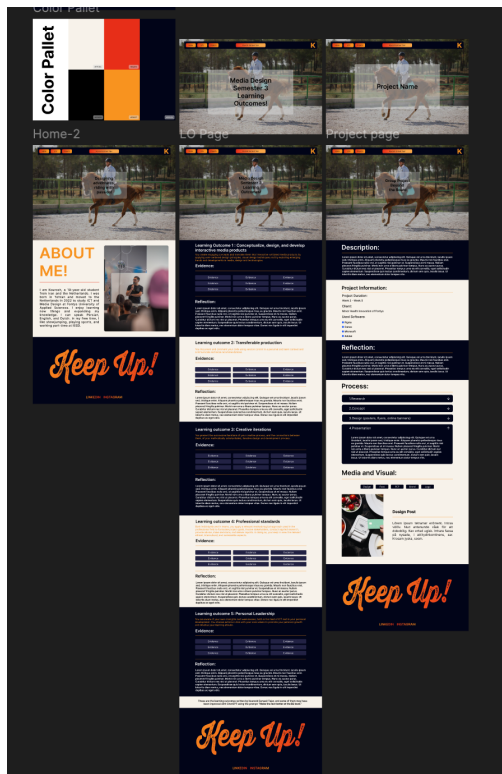
The portfolio has three main parts. The homepage introduces me and gives a short background about my Media Design journey. The Learning Outcomes section is split into five parts, matching the five official learning outcomes for the semester. Each part includes a short description of the outcome, the evidence I used to show my work, and a reflection where I talk about what I learned and how I improved.

The Projects page shows the projects I worked on. For each project, I give an HTML page, and in each project page, a short description, Project information (about the tools I used, duration, etc.), Reflection, Process of the project and the visuals.

Before coding the portfolio, I designed everything in Figma. I focused on clear navigation. I also made mood boards that gave me visual ideas and helped shape the design of the website.



I chose this format for my portfolio because it is clear and easy to understand. Splitting it into homepage, learning outcomes, and projects makes it easier for others to see my progress. Using reflections, images, and documents helps show my learning in a complete and organised way.
